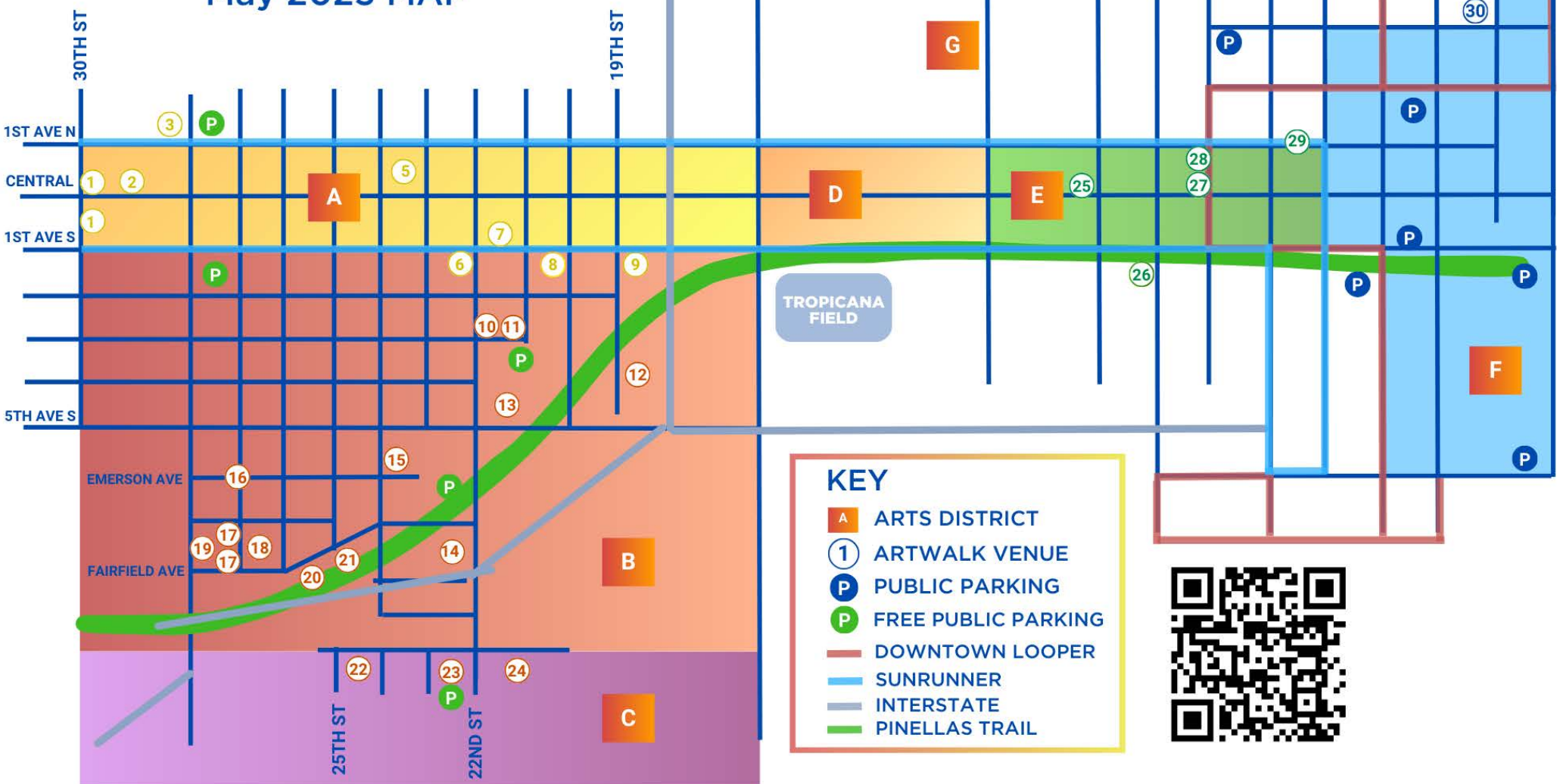

This homecoming exhibition will showcase a selection of his classic “Exit Music” paintings, as well as a number of new bodies of work in the “Exit Music” vein that he developed for exhibitions and projects outside the region over the last decade, from Illinois and Ft. Lauderdale, to California and Japan. Central to the exhibition will be a 90-piece dimensional work called “Ten Measure Tune”, an interpretation of the classic jazz composition “Blue In Green” by Miles Davis and Bill Evans, featuring John Coltrane on saxophone. This song is famous for being 10 measures long, rather than the typical 8, 12 or 16 measures. Beard color-coded each note of the main piano and bass line, as well as the trumpet, piano, and sax solos floating above the main line, using online charts that translate sound to color based on the relationship of their wavelengths. Initially developed in 2019 as a potential commission for a large column in a condo, Beard couldn’t escape his obsession with guiding this piece into existence and is excited to share it publicly for the first time at The Werk Gallery.

During last month, we hosted an insightful artist talk with Derek Donnelly about his mural we inherited with our space. Our efforts are constantly inspired by the work that adorns our walls and we wanted to keep the conversation going by launching a series of talks with the artists, organizations, and businesses featured in the mural, sharing their often undocumented and untold stories. Fixtures: Talking to the Wall - A monthly series of intimate conversations with the figures immortalized in our mural — artists who helped define our creative DNA. Each talk opens a window into the room beyond the painted walls, the people who shaped St. Pete behind the scenes, and curated the city's culture. For May's edition, we've invited an unspoken behind the scenes hero of the St. Pete arts scene, Austin David of the ARTISSIN. His mom-and-pop shop specializes in art supplies for street art and graffiti, plus pieces from local artists, and is a beloved fixture of the city. As a natural play on artisan, the name actually stands for Art Is Sin and is pronounced Ar Tis' Sin, which recognizes graffiti as art, but also the illicit nature of it as a culture originally rooted in unsanctioned creations by youth trying to make their mark on their urban landscape, using streets, subway tunnels, and any canvases they could access. Against the laws of city governance, this dynamic harkens back to the early days when churches ruled and art was considered a sin. Bronx born, David has a connection to NYC's original graffiti culture. He grew up surrounded by it and began his own immersion into the art form from the early age of 8 (in 1992). His passion for art, including anime and street art in all its various forms, is lifelong, but his own practice slowed down due to adulting, job, life, etc. and he took on more of a

supporting role when he moved to the Sunshine City in 2010. Realizing a need for a specialized art supply shop to support the area's burgeoning street art culture, he opened his first storefront at Central Avenue and 23rd St. before a negative landlord experience led to him moving to his current spot on Dr. Martin Luther King St. N. in 2012. Running a shop like David's is a unique experience where he meets all kinds of folks and artists, serving as an important gathering point for the community that goes beyond just material matters and supplies, fostering impassioned conversations and connections — much like an artist's version of the dynamic social culture of barbershops. We will continue on some of the themes of last month's kick off conversation with Donnelly, such as how the rising rent prices and gentrification of the city makes shops like the ARTISSIN's existence hard, rare, and increasingly extinct. Many small business staples of the Sunshine City since David's decade plus time here have gone dark, disappeared, or been entirely erased aside from persisting in our collective memories.
