

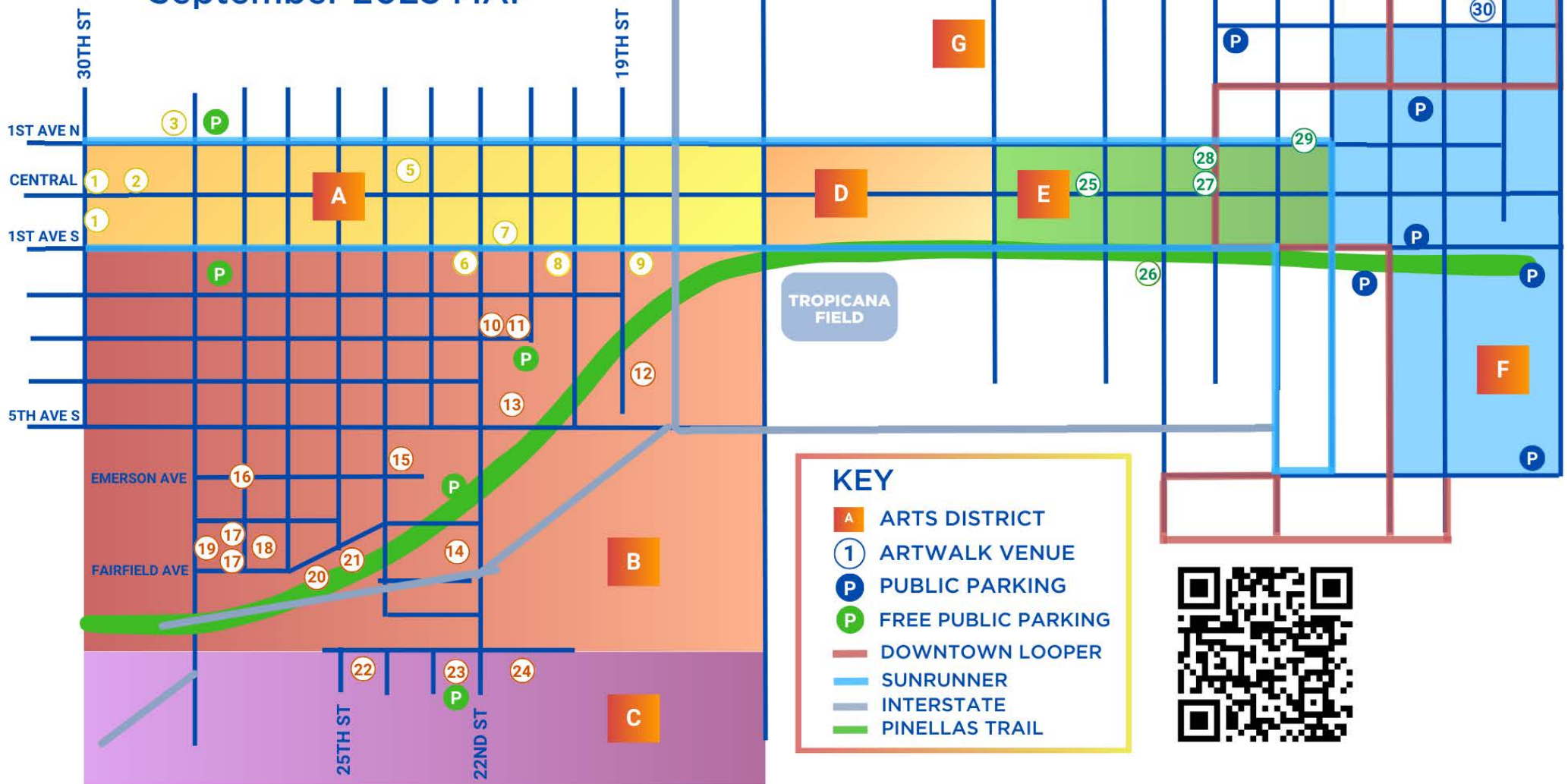

In the exhibition, you will find artisanal ceramic sculptures intended for more than just our viewing pleasures. When submerged, Samuels and Morrison's art becomes a new habitat for marine life. Nina Samuels focuses on the contrast and connections between industrial items and marine growth, which stems from her marine restoration work submerging ceramic pieces underwater. Her exhibiting art features a series of manmade objects covered in marine life – both sculpted and real. Viewers will find ceramic vessels with meticulously sculpted and glazed textures, sculpted marine debris with ceramic growth, vessel shaped buoys with real barnacle growth, a small tank with native living growth on it and more. Nature has always been at the center of Charles Morrison's work. "I often use wild clays and other natural materials as a medium to sculpt with. When I'm not using materials I have sourced from the earth, I'm making work inspired by it. Having grown up by the ocean and now being an artist in coastal Florida, I use the sea as a starting point for my ideas. Anything from the humblest microorganisms to the most revered fish in the sea are a constant source of inspiration. Whether I am making anatomically correct versions of sea creatures or using an abstracted version of their forms in a sculpture, the fluid nature of all ocean species comes to life in clay. The more I studied marine biology for my work, the more I marveled at it and desired to have another dimension of interaction in my work. I have begun making ceramic sculptures and submerging them underwater to serve as artificial marine reefs. This provides a habitat for the very creatures I am so inspired by."

Our studio's efforts are consistently inspired by the Derek Donnelly mural adorning the walls of the space we inherited, who previously had joined us to share insight about his work in an insightful question and answer. We wanted to keep the conversation going through a series of talks with the artists, organizations, and businesses featured in the mural, sharing their often undocumented and untold stories. Fixtures: Talking to the Wall - A monthly series of intimate conversations with the figures immortalized in our mural — artists who helped define our creative DNA. Each talk opens a window into the room beyond the painted walls, the people who shaped St. Pete behind the scenes, and curated the city's culture. For Junes's edition, we've invited artist, studio gallery owner, and non-profit organizer John Gascot to help us celebrate Pride. John established his studio in Pinellas Park over nine years ago and played a key role in founding the city's arts district, which Derrick Donnelly also calls home. For nearly a decade, he collaborated closely with city officials to develop a thriving arts community through a Community Redevelopment initiative. In 2023, he was given the opportunity to take on Artist Ownership of the Studios @ 5663 property—an essential link in the partnership between the city and local artists. Today, Studios @ 5663 hosts seven individual artist studios, two galleries, and two nonprofit organizations, including Diversity Arts. Now in its second year, Diversity Arts' Summer Art Camp offers free expressive arts programming to children from a wide range of cultural and economic backgrounds. This summer alone, the camp is expected to serve more than 400 kids. A queer artist hailing from the Caribbean, Gascot traces his childhood roots to Puerto Rico, an origin that fuels his passion for vibrant hues. While he delves into diverse artistic styles such as Painterly and Geometric Abstractions, his hallmark remains the Latin Pop genre. Coined affectionately after years of honing his craft, "Latin Pop" merges Pop art, Cubism, and Folk art, resulting in a distinct visual dialect. These artworks serve as modern narratives, blending global influences to challenge cultural barriers. In John's Latin Pop creations, cultural boundaries blur as diverse influences intertwine in contemporary tales. His aim is to craft art that is both inclusive and thought-provoking, questioning social and gender norms dictated by various societies.

I love creating abstract paintings using pasted designs of paper or fabric. “Somehow, the idea arose to create art objects from wood waste discarded by skyscraper builders after the construction was completed.” Caelan Jeffery: Appalachia--Latch-not-Lay - “For this particular exhibition, over 20 works of art were made of hand cut leather on a wooden frame. Mediums include shoulder stock leather, wood, spray paint, acrylics, watercolors, leather dyes, archival inks, brad tack nails, upholstery tacks, artificial sinew, studs, and fur. “Each piece was carefully rendered from selected historical black and white photographs taken throughout the 1900s that represent Appalachian history. *Influencers: 2025 Members Show - The 2025 members exhibition showcases nearly 200 works of art with an “Influencers” theme, inviting artists to think about who (or what) influenced them, then using that inspiration to create something using paint, ceramics, metal,

photography, and. Each Morean member is invited to submit one work of art for the exhibition. Danny Olda, Curatorial Director at the Dunedin Fine Art Center, serves as guest juror, helping to choose awards for participating artists.
