

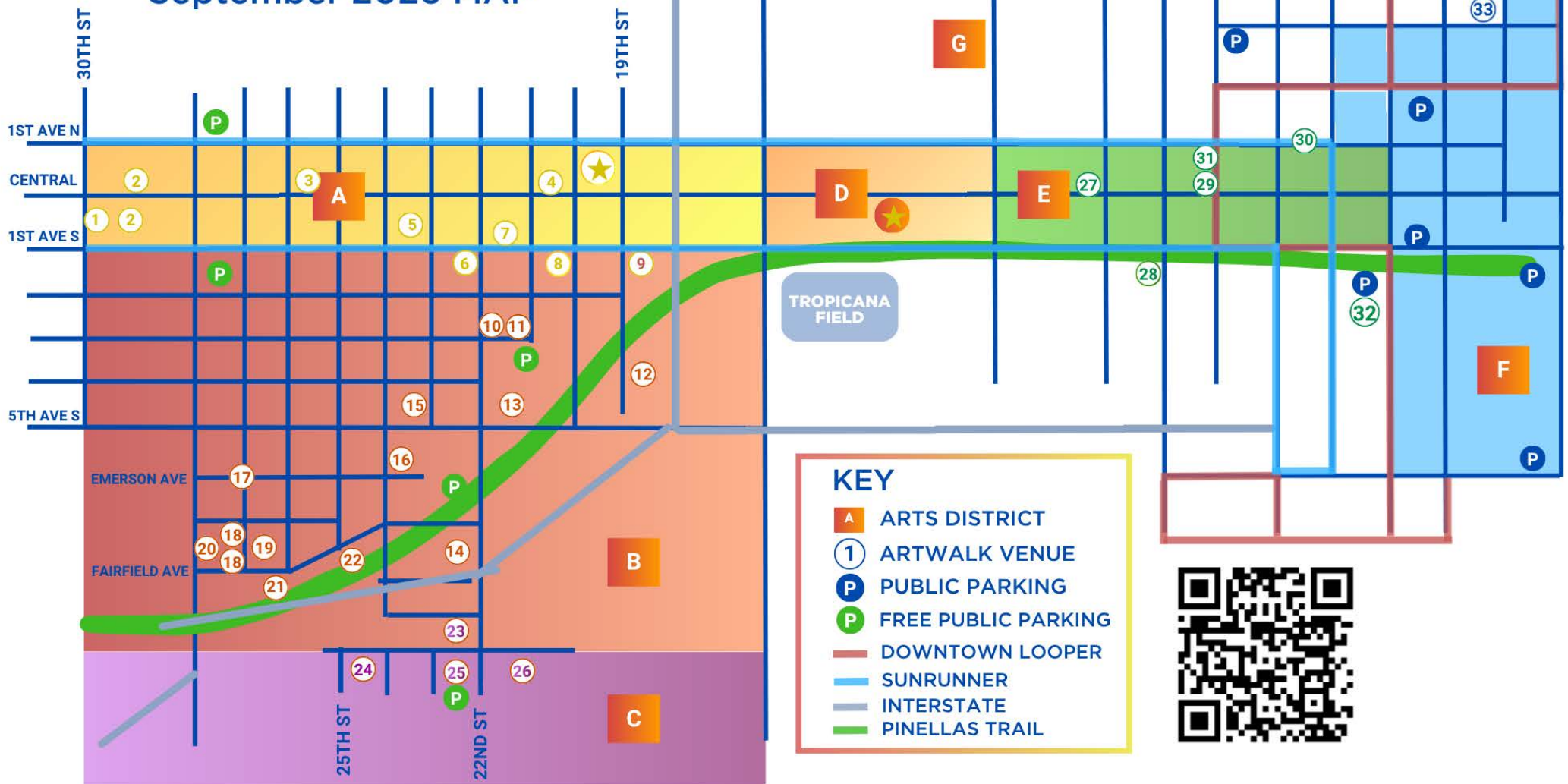

Artist Talk: Saturday September 19, 3-4pm - St. Petersburg, FL – Enter realms of myth and fantasy at the Werk Gallery this September as we feature paintings and illustrations by Clearwater artist, C. Michael Erickson. Drawing inspiration from global myths and the European Middle Ages, Erickson's work aims to reconnect to history through the myths, stories and ideas that shape our thinking and storytelling today. He is influenced by early Disney films, painters like John William Waterhouse for his emotional and painterly realism, Frank Frazetta for his dynamic compositions, and Larry Elmore for his visual storytelling strengths. To create his highly realistic scenes, he employs “Old Master” techniques like graphite scrubbing to transfer a drawing to the canvas and grisaille (black and white underpainting) to establish values before finishing the painting with layers of color. Erickson is especially fond of composing “problem pictures”, a genre born in the late-Victorian age that depicts figures in ambiguous scenes, inviting the viewer to speculate and complete the narrative in their mind. With his painting “Slayer”, we are first confronted with the archetypal Dragon vs. Knight scene until we recognize that the Dragon's aggression is defensive as she is protecting her nest. Although Erickson's technical skill is beyond question, it is his ability to probe ambiguity through the recasting of myth that sets him apart.

This showcase brings long-overdue attention to Georgia's vibrant woodfiring tradition, highlighting a multigenerational collective of artists. The artist collective spans through folk pottery lineages, Japanese kiln traditions, and contemporary ceramic artistry, united by a shared devotion to the centuries-old craft of woodfiring. The group includes some of the most influential names in Southern pottery, among them legacy potters with more than 30 years of firing experience such as Roger Jamison, Geoff Pickett, Jon Brinley, and Allen Gee, as well as studio innovators including Stephen Hawks, and Ron Meyers. Equally central to the movement are the next generation of fire chiefs and apprentices—Rebecca Wood, Kyle Jones, and Liz Bloodgood, and a rising cohort of nationally recognized ceramic artists including Linda Suskin, Kimberly Shelton and Joel Huff. "Woodfiring remains deeply rooted in Georgia's cultural landscape," Joel Huff, a ceramic artist said. "Potters often travel great distances and work through the night to participate in firings that range from short, traditional folk sessions, echoing the iconic Meaders, Gordy, and Hewell families, to multi-day Anagama and Naborigama firings inspired by the traditional Japanese practices." With kiln sites spread across small rural communities in Juliette, Farmington (Pickett's Pottery), Midland (County Line Art Farm), Greenville (Primrose Flattop), Rabun Gap (Hambidge Center for the Creative Arts), Comer, and beyond, this set of artists is sure to inspire. The exhibition is free and open to the public from Wednesday to Saturday, 10am-5pm, on view September 12 – October 3.
