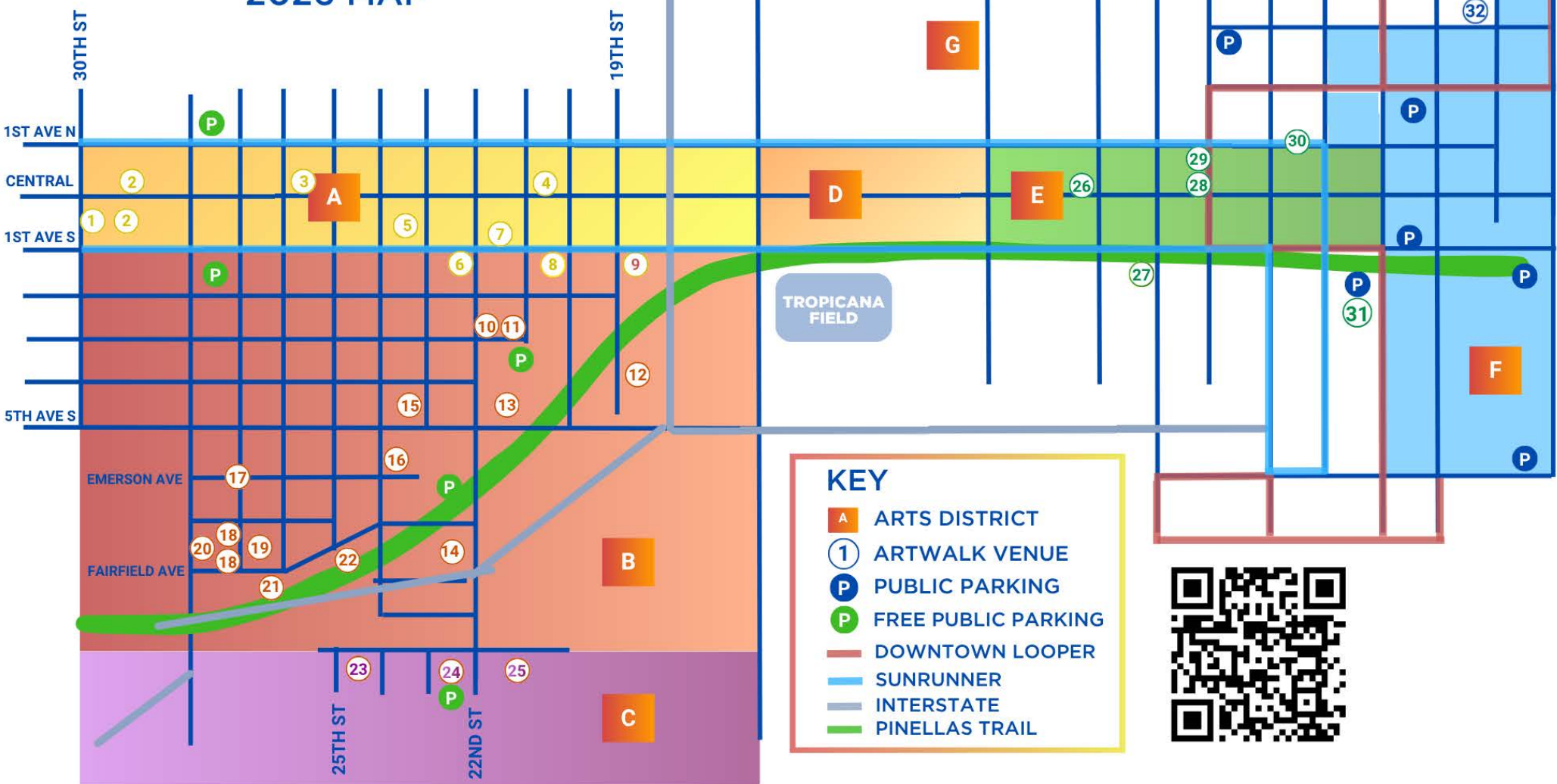

This exhibition is not only a celebration of the impressive array of techniques and media the artists employ, but also of the type of sustainable community that can be built through mutual respect for each other’s creativity and humanity. “Surface Design is the coloring, patterning, structuring and transformation of fabric, fiber, and other materials. The purpose of the Guild is to increase community awareness of surface design and its value in our lives. As a group, we exchange information on such creative processes as dyeing, painting, printing, stitching, embellishing, quilting, weaving, knitting, felting, beading, basket making, polymer clay, crochet, and paper making. We also offer educational and experimental venues, thus supporting individual artistic creativity, while promoting an attitude of mutual respect and exchange in all areas surface design.” The Surface Design Guild was founded in the early 90’s by a group of four women who wanted to share their knowledge and learn from each other. That small group became what is known today as the Tampa Bay Surface Design Guild, and has grown to a membership of well over 100 members. Many of the members have had their art recognized both nationally and internationally, yet as a group they are still committed to their original values of supporting each other’s artistic goals and sharing knowledge with each other and the community.

Both create works that are deceptively complex in their simplicity, and that provide a perfect complement to sophisticated interiors across a broad variety of design styles.

Due to the heat, we won't have hot glass demonstrations from May through the summer months, but there's much to see in the way of already created museum-quality artwork, both inside the gallery space as well as in the sculpture garden, where 71 varieties of tropical trees are thriving and orchids are still in bloom.
