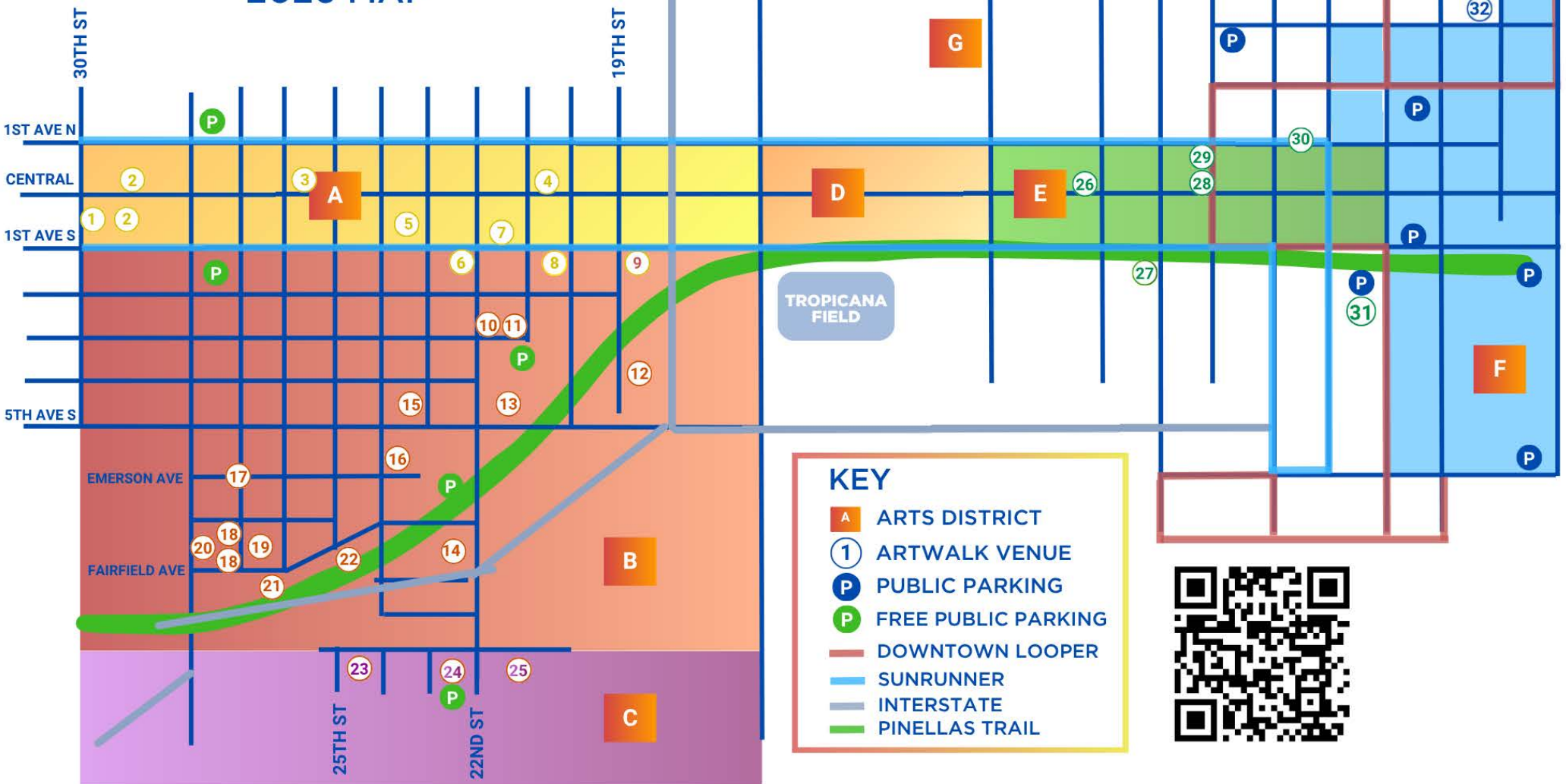

In this momentous exhibition, "CEREMONY", Rhys's work will present the case for resilience over suffering, purpose over complacency and for LOVE, above all! Rhys Meatyard is a third generation queer/trans artist, living and working in St. Petersburg, Florida. He was influenced from a young age by the work of his grandfather – Tampa metal sculptor and lifelong educator Jerry Meatyard, his brother – pioneering postmodern photographer Ralph Eugene Meatyard, and his mother Laura Meatyard, who was (among many other things) a monument designer responsible for a great number of headstones and other stone memorials all over the state. According to Rhys, "Victor Frankl, holocaust survivor and author of "Man's Search for Meaning," tried to teach us that even in the most desperate of circumstances, we must find purpose - that without purpose, we cannot maintain our humanity and will to survive. In this show, my goal is to help the viewer find the right questions to ask themselves, to create space for the collective grief of the moment, to create space for the collective love and joy we must maintain to keep up the fight. Grief is the ultimate price of love, but it is a risk we must be willing to take, or we risk losing what makes us human at all. If we lose that, we have already lost everything." Bleu, originally from the Midwest, showcases the artwork that came from her two years in Florida as a Morean artist in residence and current technician. She emphasizes the certain kindness instilled in the Midwest. Bleu explains “There are quiet customs we commit to that form strong communities. One of these habits that holds a place in my heart is the Midwest goodbye. When any sort of gathering or shared meal comes to an end, a goodbye is never enough. Friends and families involuntarily start new topics of conversation in an attempt to hang onto more time spent together.”

Alonso-Rodriguez's striking work references architectural and botanical influences, as well as lingering memories of his childhood in Havana. Both create works that are deceptively complex in their simplicity, and that provide a perfect complement to sophisticated interiors across a broad variety of design styles.

Due to the heat, we won't have hot glass demonstrations from May through the summer months, but there's much to see in the way of already created museum-quality artwork, both inside the gallery space as well as in the sculpture garden, where 71 varieties of tropical trees are thriving and orchids are still in bloom.
